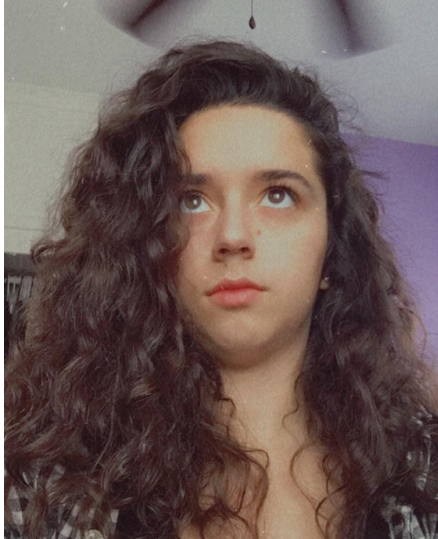

What is AGS?

Alpha Gamma Sigma, our purpose is to foster, promote, maintain, and recognize scholarship. The goals of the Alpha Phi Chapter at El Camino College are to encourage members to pursue their academics while also being involved on campus/in the community. As a chapter, we want to provide an environment for members to be surrounded by like-minded individuals where they can develop their leadership skills that will benefit them later on in their academic and career goals.

Types of Membership

Blue: most of or members are blue

- Required to earn a total of 6 points
 - 2 points from meetings
 - 2 points of service
 - 2 points for campus events

Silver: students with 16+ units or working 40+ hours a week

- Required to earn a total of 3 points
 - 1 points from meetings
 - 1 points of service
 - 1 points for campus events

GPA Requirement:

- For those with less than 12 units in college → 3.50 gpa using high school transcript or proof of life membership in CSF
- For those with 12 units or more in college → 3.00 gpa

- <https://www.cancer.org/involved/volunteer/online-and-social.html> → very easy work, must be social media literate, hard to accumulate multiple “hours”
- <https://www.pgdp.net/c/accounts/addproofer.php> → must have PROFICIENT reading/writing skills, proofreading works of literature

Online Volunteer Opportunities

- <https://careers.amnesty.org/vacancy/find/results/> → similar to UNV, ork is long-term based and opportunities may be hard to find, best for college applications
- <https://www.redcross.org/volunteer/become-a-volunteer.html> → type of work varies widely, most offers are in-person, very easy to find hours
- <https://www.zooniverse.org/get-involved> → assisting in professional research, very user friendly to find a topic of interest for each user
- <https://www.crisistextline.org/become-a-volunteer/> → very emotionally heavy work, 30 hours of mandatory, unpaid training, work is primarily from 7pm-3am

How To Join

- 1) Go to the website
- 2) Fill out the general membership application
- 3) Write a paper or present a speech or presentation
 - a) More about this on the next slide
- 4) Submit application via email along with paper/ recording of speech or presentation by April 5th!
- 5) Await your acceptance!

Speech/ Paper/ Presentation

Instead of monetary dues we are requiring a written paper, or a recorded speech / presentation.

- Possible Topics
 - “What does honor society mean to you?”
 - “Why did you pick your major?”
 - “Explain the transfer process”
 - “What does leadership mean to you?”
 - Or you can pick your own topic if it is related to academics, leadership, or service and must be approved by cabinet member
 - Requirements
 - Must be sent via email by April 5th
 - The speech or powerpoint must be 5 mins long
 - The paper must be 1000 words

Permanent Membership

Who Qualifies

- Those with 60 units, with 30 units from El Camino, and 2 semesters in AGS need a 3.25 GPA to qualify
- Those with 60 units, with 30 units from El Camino, and 1 semesters in AGS need a 3.50 GPA to qualify
